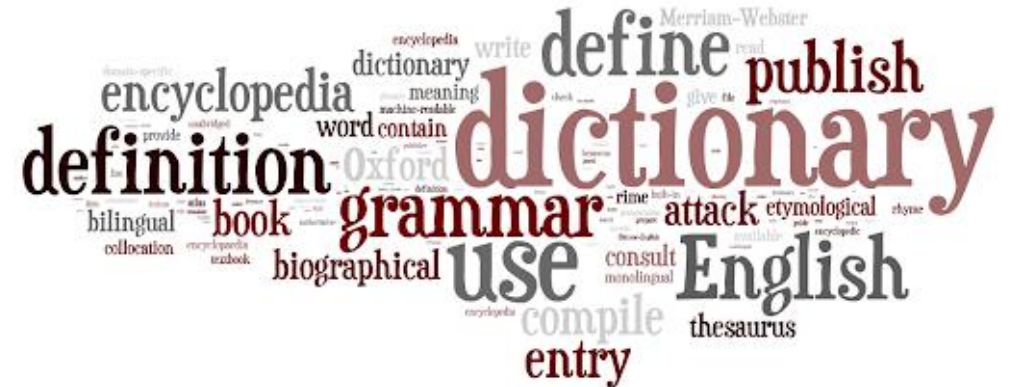

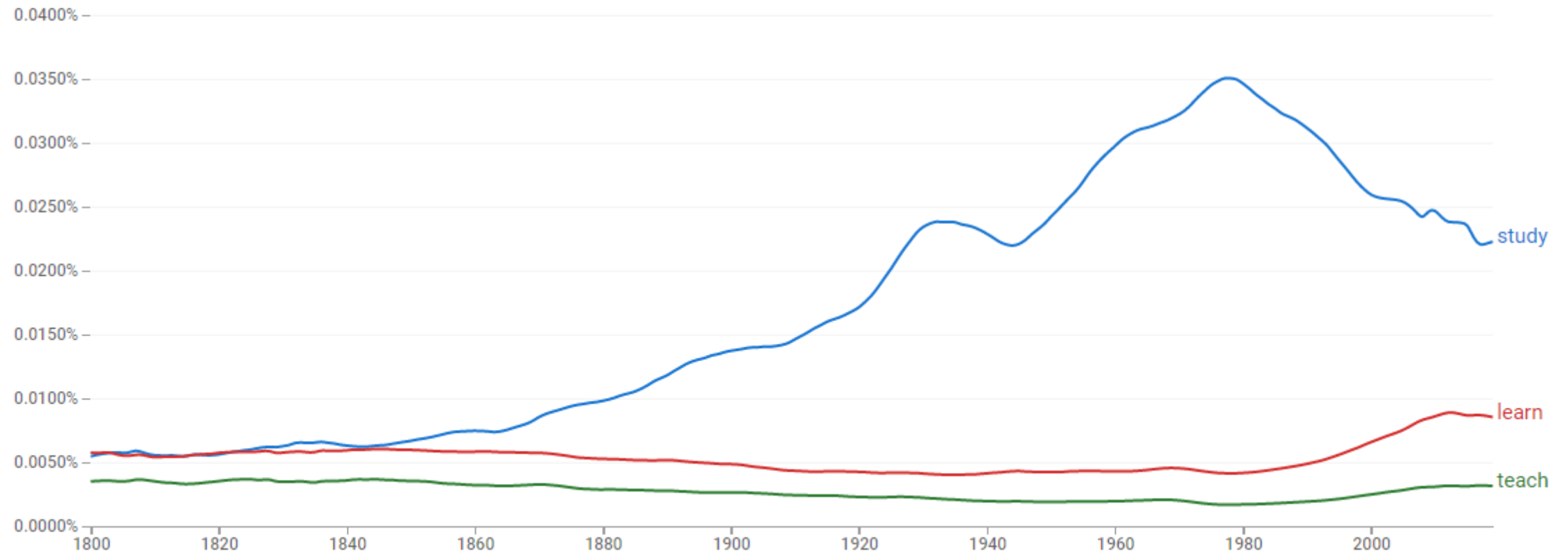

but for the information, instruction, or assistance of the maker; as, a study of heads or of hands for a figure picture.

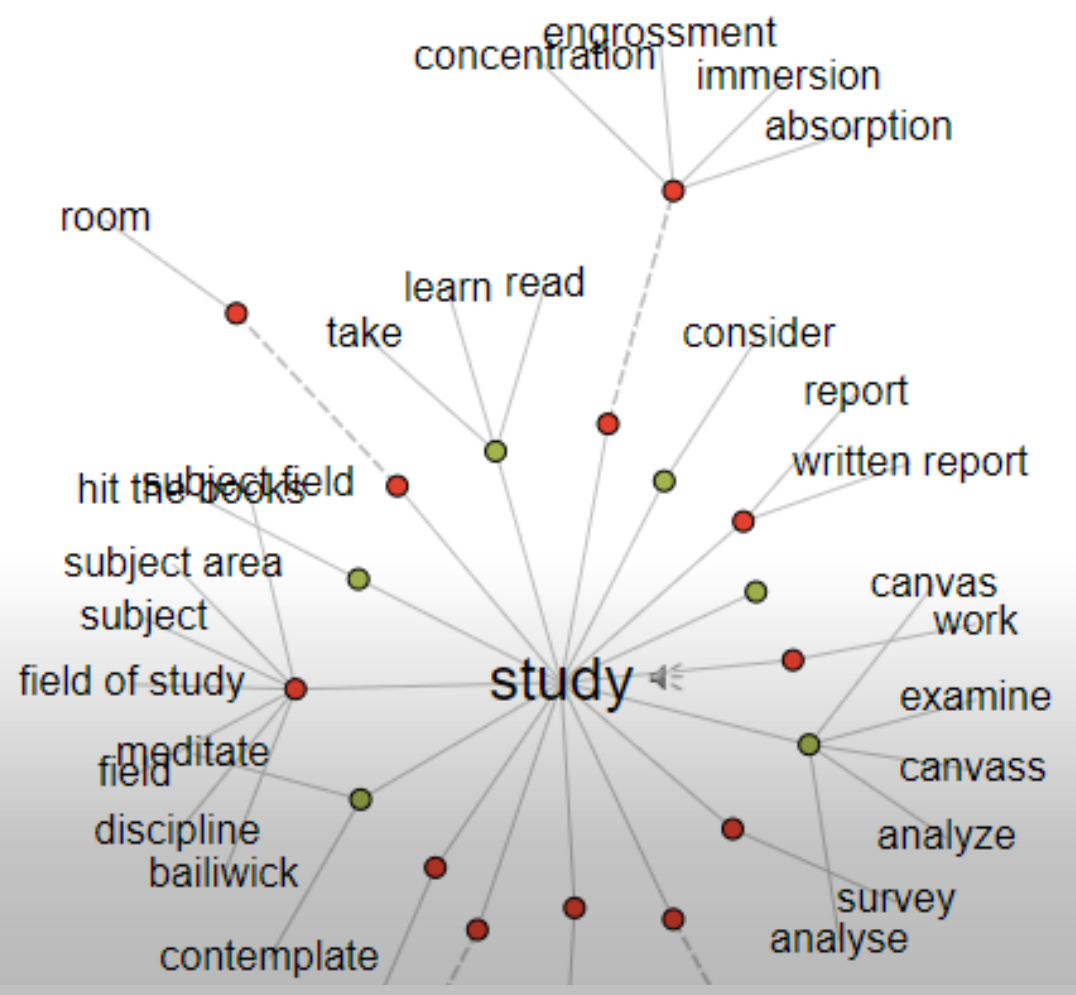

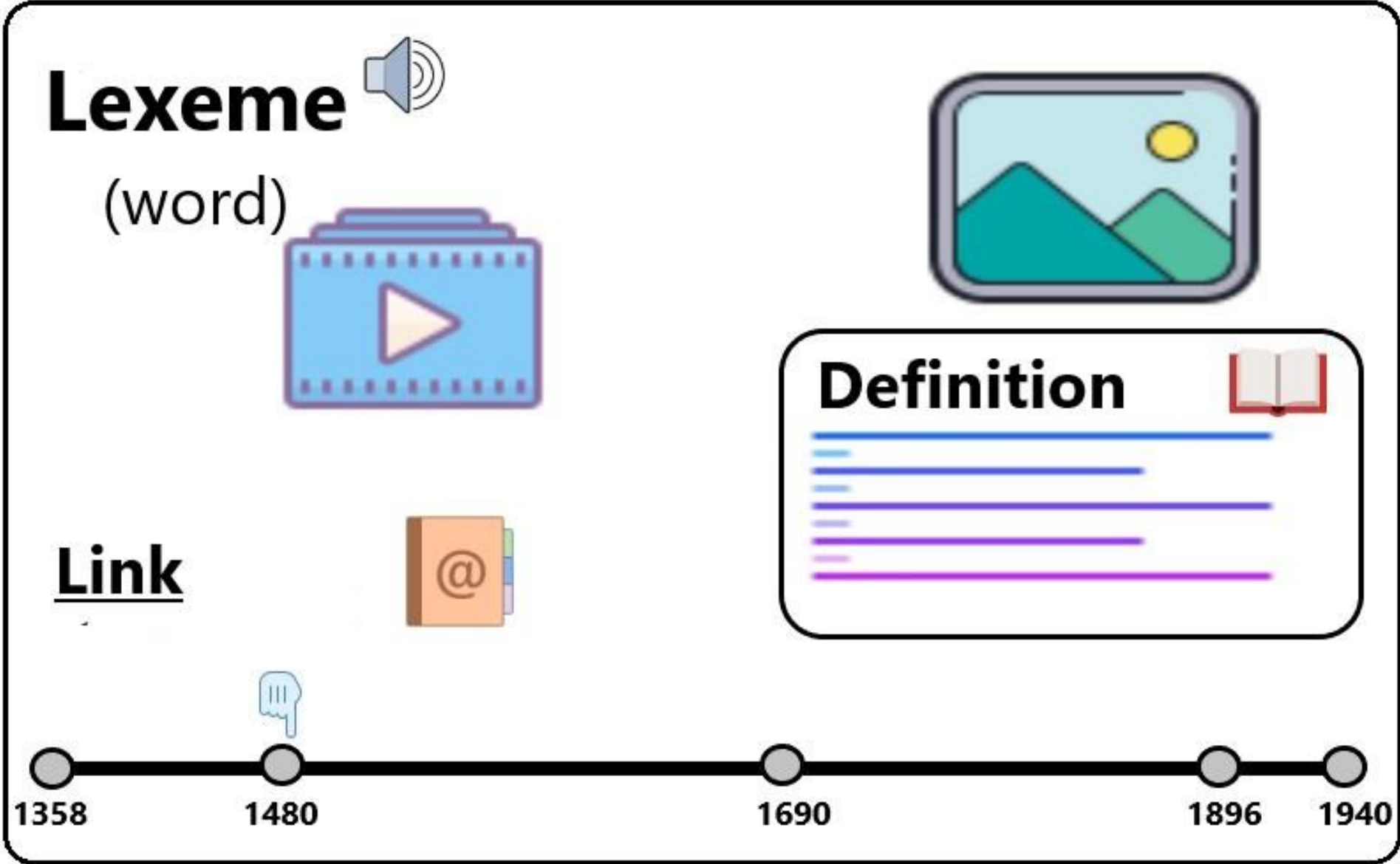
